

International Police Clearance Certificate

The National Vetting Bureau (NVB) do not conduct international vetting.

An applicant who has lived outside of Ireland (ROI/NI) when over the age of 18, must provide Bus Éireann with an International Police Clearance Certificate from all of the countries they have lived in. The clearance must be dated after the date the applicant left the country.

This clearance is mandatory in order to work with children and vulnerable adults.

The police clearance document may also be known as a different name in each country. *For example the required police clearance is known as an International Child Protection Certificate or Enhanced Disclosure in some countries.*

Please note: Bus Éireann will not accept a Basic Disclosures or Disclosure for Immigration Purposes.

Bus Éireann will reject applications that fail to produce international police clearance as the application will be deemed incomplete.

Seeking police clearance from other countries is the responsibility of the applicant.

You may find it helpful to contact the relevant embassy for more information on obtaining a police clearance certificate. For police clearance that is not in the English language you must provide a certified translated copy.
